Proudly serving the Communities of: Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Cleveland Metropolitan Park District and the Ohio State Patrol Pursuant to Section 1901.14(A)(4) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Berea Municipal Court herewith submits its 48th Annual Report for the year 2006. The contents of this report are based on data assembled and tabulated by Raymond J. Wohl, the Clerk of Court and his staff of Deputy Clerks. This report reflects the financial and statistical activity of the Court in detail with respect to all political subdivisions within the Court district.

The Berea Municipal Court has been located in the City of Berea, by an act of the Ohio Legislature, since 1958. The Court district boundaries cover an area of 60.8 square miles and have a total population of 118,125 (per 2000 U.S. Census).

The Court serves the cities of Berea, Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, Olmsted Falls, Olmsted Township, Strongsville, in addition to the Ohio Turnpike (Ohio State Patrol) in Strongsville, Berea, and Olmsted Township; Interstate 71 (Ohio State Patrol) in Brook Park, Middleburg Heights, and Strongsville; Interstate 480 in Brook Park (Ohio State Patrol); and the Cleveland Metropolitan Park System within the Berea Municipal Court's boundaries.

It is with great pleasure that we present to you the 2006 Berea Municipal Court Annual Report.

Highlights

2006 was a transitional year for the Berea Municipal Court. The Civil Department saw a 9% increase in new filings compared to calendar year 2005. While our Traffic/Criminal Department, for the first time in many years, saw an overall decrease in new filings. The decrease in new filings was evident in many cities within our jurisdiction.

During 2006 the Berea Municipal Court received over \$75,000 in waiver payments, an increase of 64% through the use of our website. The availability of this resource provides convenience to violators saving a trip to Court to make a payment in person. In addition, our website had over 85,000 visits in 2006 with over 1.1 million pages being accessed in those visits.

As in the past, the Court on the Road initiative was continued at Berea High School with the junior and senior classes observing live Court as it was conducted in the school auditorium.

The current state of our economy continues to have a negative effect on our ability to collect fines and costs. In 2006 we directed outstanding fines and costs in the amount of \$260,000 to our outside collection firm, Capital Recovery Systems. This amount was turned over despite our efforts to collect, which include warrants for non appearance, blockage of drivers license renewals and license plate renewals. In addition, money owing hearings are being held on a monthly basis with approximately 140 cases being heard in a day to attempt to collect these outstanding fines and costs. Since Capital Recovery was retained,

we have assigned approximately \$1.1 million dollars to them for collection. Over \$356,000 has been collected without cost to this Court or the taxpayers of our district.

In 2006 our computer system was upgraded preparing the Court to go forward with the imaging of court records. This will be a huge undertaking for the next calendar year. Lack of storage at the Berea Municipal Court costs the Court approximately \$15,000 a year to store records at an offsite location.

We continue working in an obsolete facility without proper space requirements, telephones, courtrooms and security. As always, we are concerned about the safety of our employees, defendants and individuals using the Court on a daily basis. However, it is getting to the point that the current facility is having a negative impact on the courts ability to conduct business in a legal, safe and confident manner that the public deserves.

A heartfelt thank you to the entire staff including our Acting Judges, Magistrates, staff of the Traffic/Criminal Division, Civil Division, Probation and Bailiffs, for the outstanding job they provided in 2006. Our staff of Deputy Clerks are truly professionals and complete their work in an efficient and business-like manner, and are ever mindful of the people we serve. We would like to especially acknowledge John Mills who "retired" as our Special Deputy Bailiff after 13 years of volunteer service to the Court.

In closing, thank you to Mayor Joseph W. Biddlecombe, his directors, staff and Berea City Council, Police Chief Mark Schultz and his officers for their support. We appreciate your kindness, the confidence you have in us and your cooperation with us in the administration of the Berea Municipal Court.

In conclusion, you can rest assured that we will continue to monitor and evaluate the operations and expenses of the Court and to ensure that that the Berea Municipal Court is operated in a fiscally responsible and business-like manner.

2006 COMMUNITY CONTROL SANCTIONS REPORT

The Community Control Department had a staff of five full time employees and a part-time intern serving at the pleasure of the Judge at the beginning of 2006. By the end of the year the staff was reduced to three full-time employees, one part-time employee, and one part-time intern. The Community Control Officers supervised, as directed by the court, approximately 2,081 defendants during 2006. In addition, the Community Control Department monitored at least 688 defendants attending various Alcoholics Anonymous meetings.

At the direction of the Judge, the SCRAM (Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitor) unit was implemented into practice for those defendants who display a more serious problem with alcohol and its effects. The SCRAM unit could be used in cases of OVI offenses or those offenses in which alcohol was a factor. The SCRAM unit monitors a defendant 24 hours a day and will detect the slightest use of alcohol. This provides the court with a more accurate perception of how alcohol fits into the daily routine of a defendant. Therefore, the court can refer the defendant to an alcohol treatment program that fits his/her needs. There have been 7 defendants placed on the SCRAM unit in 2006.

The DUS Diversion Program continued to succeed this year in helping approximately 189 defendants reinstate their driver's license. The First Offenders Program also had continued succeeding by allowing approximately 59 defendants the opportunity to amend their behavior and avoid having a conviction record and prevent recidivism.

The Chief Community Control Officer continues to speak at the 72 hour Driver Intervention Program once a month and during the aftercare program of the outpatient alcohol program. She also continues to conduct a discussion group for defendants charged with public indecency which involved 8 defendants in 2006.
